The meeting of the Research and Projects Review Committee will be held in Lovejoy Library, Room 0051, October 25, at 1:30 p.m.

Major General Robert R. Ploger, Commanding General of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers Topographic Command, will give a public lecture on maps on Thursday, Oct. 24. The 8:00 p.m. lecture, titled "Mapping: A Measure of National Development," will be held in the Auditorium of Lovejoy Library. Hosts for the annual map library lecture are the Social Sciences Division and Lovejoy Library. This fall General Ploger was named topographer of the Army in his position as Commanding General of the U. S. Army Topographic Command.

His responsibilities embrace all mapping activities around the world for the Army and the management of mapping resources allocated to the Army in producing maps and map products dealing with all areas of the world. He has been concerned with these responsibilities since September of last year, and prior to that time was personally responsible for mapping operations in South Vietnam.

The Faculty of Historical Studies will hold two conferences for faculty and students during the month of November. The first will be a discussion of the election results of 1968, and is scheduled for 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 6. The co-sponsor for this event will be the Faculty of Government and Public Affairs. The second will be devoted to recognition of the 50th anniversary of the armistice ending World War I, and various members of the history faculty will discuss that event and the period which followed. This conference is scheduled for Monday, Nov. 11, at 1 p.m. Both meetings will be held in the Mississippi Room of the University Center.
