SUBJECT: Operations in New Buildings; Remodeling of Core Buildings

Classes are being held this week in our new facilities in Classroom Building III. Office furnishings are being installed in Buildings II and III, but moves to new offices will be limited during the first two weeks of classes.

The first offices to be moved will be Earth Sciences of the School of Social Sciences and Art and Design of the School of Fine Arts and Communications. These will be moved the week of October 4-8.

Offices of the School of Education are scheduled to be transferred during the last two weeks of October and the first two weeks of November.

The schedule for the remaining offices to be moved will be announced later.

Spaces vacated by units moving to Classroom Buildings II and III will be remodeled to their originally intended usage. Plans for remodeling the four core buildings are being prepared by Lee Potter Smith Associates, Carbondale, and a final review of drawings and specifications by the Capital Development Board is scheduled September 29, with the bid opening tentatively scheduled for October 26.

University officers and various department heads affected by this remodeling have been in close coordination with representatives of the Capital Development Board.

We are elated that our dream of new facilities is finally coming true, but problems are inherent with the occupancy of any new building, and we seek your patient indulgence and cooperation as we begin our "shakedown cruise."
