SUBJECT: PBS Videotaping on Campus

The Public Broadcasting System (PBS) will videotape a story featuring Katherine Dunham, the Dunham Dancers and the Dunham Museum, with taping sessions in East St. Louis and on the Edwardsville campus, June 26-28. The program is being produced for the McNeil/Lehrer Report, a half-hour nationwide broadcast scheduled during the second week of July.

All members of the University community are cordially invited to be part of the audience for the "live" performance of the Dunham Dancers which will be videotaped Tuesday, June 27, from 12:30 to 1 p.m. in the Goshen Lounge of the University Center. The filming session will be free and open to the public, but photographs or film may not be shot during the actual performance. Pictures may be taken before, in between segments of dance, or after the performance.

The performance will include choreography by Miss Dunham as well as Mor Thiem, Senegalese master drummer and faculty member of the Performing Arts Training Center in East St. Louis.

After the performance, Ken Witty, producer, and Emil Ardolino, director of PBS' "Dance in America" series, both from WNET, Channel 13, New York, as well as Miss Dunham and members of the dance company, will be available for interviews with the news media.
