

On Friday morning, June 12, the University will sponsor a roundtable discussion on "The Origin of Complex Societies." Professor Melvin Fowler of the University of Wisconsin at Milwaukee, who will receive a Distinguished Service Award at Commencement, will be the principal speaker. Panelists will be Dr. Margaret Brown, of Cahokia Mounds State Park, and Dr. Sidney Denny, of SIUE. The discussion will take place from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m. in the Redbud-Oak Rooms of the University Center.

The same afternoon, Dr. Robert McC. Adams, Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, will lead a symposium on "The Two Cultures Problem." Panelists will be: Dr. Michael Friedlander, Professor of Physics, Washington University; Fr. Hugh Gray, Vice President for Academic Affairs, St. Louis University; Dr. Lawrence Barton, Professor of Chemistry, University of Missouri-St. Louis, and Dr. John Richardson, Professor of Art, SIUE. The symposium will take place from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. in the Redbud-Oak Rooms of the University Center. A reception will follow in the Maple-Dogwood Rooms. As you know, Dr. Adams will be awarded an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree at Commencement.
