State Employee and Universities Combined Appeal

For a number of years, the members of the University faculty and staff have participated in an annual charitable fund drive which provides money and services to citizens in need. This year the State Employee and Universities Combined Appeal (SECA) enables University employees to donate to ten charitable organizations: Black United Fund of Illinois; Combined Health Appeal; Illinois Special Olympics; Illinois Women's Funding Federation; International Service Agencies; Little City Serving Children and Adults with Mental Retardation; Public Interest Fund of Illinois; United Negro College Fund; United Way; and the Veterans Protective League.

The 1993 SIUE Charitable Fund Drive - SECA will be conducted from November 3 through December 3. Fund Drive materials will be distributed to each employee by liaisons in the various units.
