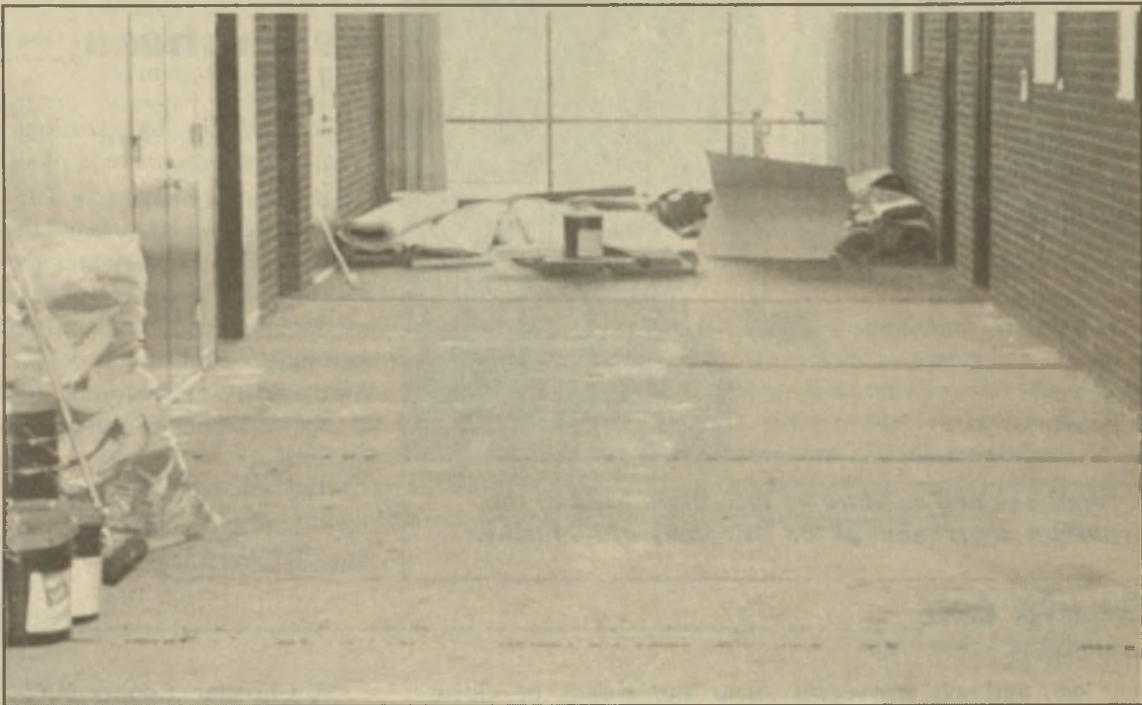
Renovations in the University Center (UC) is nearing the finish line after the project's beginnings in late spring.

## SIUE offers CPA course

SIUE's office of Continuing Education and the School of Business' department of accountancy will offer the SIUE/Conviser Duffy CPA Review Course beginning July 19.

"The course is being offered to better service SIUE graduates," Michael Costigan, chairperson of the accounting department said.

The 13-week non-credit

course is a preparatory curriculum for the Uniform Certified Public Accountant Examination. The exam is given twice a year, one in May and one in November. Costigan said SIUE offers this course starting in July for the November exam, and then offers the course again in January for the May exam. Costigan said this course services the graduates of SIUE by offering them the chance to prepare for the Uniform Certified Public Accountant Examination at a

convenient location and time.

The course will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. every Saturday through October 25 in room 2409 of Building II. The course costs \$1,120 for SIUE graduates and \$1,320 for non-SIUE graduates. Costigan said enrollment is currently underway, or students are welcome to attend the first day of classes for an invitational packet and may enroll at that time.

## Congressman Shimkus works to cut death tax

Congressman John Shimkus has joined forces with congressional leaders and the president, as a co-sponsor to eliminate federal estate taxes responsible for hurting middle class, family-owned businesses and farms.

Steven Tomaszewski, spokesperson for Shimkus, said the federal estate tax, also known as the "death tax," had existed in previous years.

"It's been around for a while but it's undergone changes throughout the years," Tomaszewski said.

The objective of the death tax is to keep families from accumulating large estates and to promote the redistribution of wealth. When the land is to be handed to the next generation due to a death in the family, the federal government can confiscate between 37 to 55 percent of that family's after-tax savings. Tomaszewski said there is hope through the recent bipartisan Balanced

Budget Plan that addresses the tax policy.

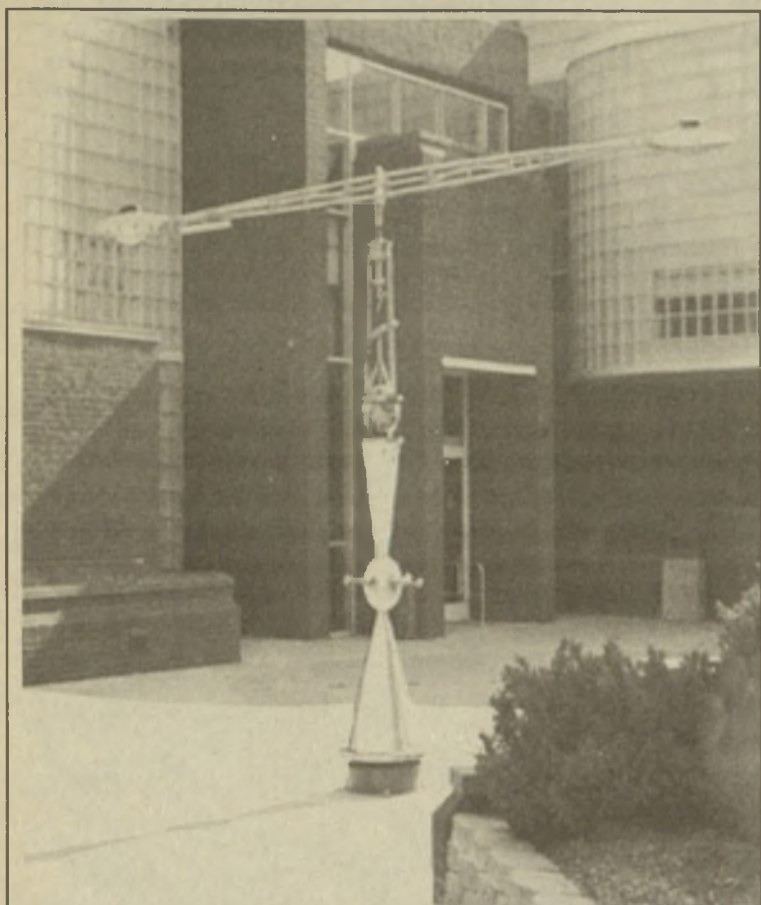
"In capital gain we are hoping to reduce it to 19 to 20 percent," Tomaszewski said.

The findings of an independent analyses by the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, showed that a repeal of the taxes on transfer, gift and estate, would increase the nation's economic output by \$77 billion, create more than one million new jobs and increase personal income by \$56 billion over the next seven years. Tomaszewski said there were two proposals for the repeal through the bipartisan Balanced Budget Plan introduced in the U.S. House on March 3.

"There are two proposals geared toward eliminating the death tax," Tomaszewski said. "One would be to double the exemptions to \$1.2 million and keep the tax with the larger exemption, and the other is to raise the amount from \$600,000 to \$1 million by the

## Increase in domestic postal rates

The U.S. Postal Service Board of Governors finalized the postal rate increase last week, which will take effect May, 1998.

The increase went from 32 cents to 33 cents on all first class stamps. St. Louis Postal Customs Collections

Coordinator Renee Susor said this increase will affect only domestic mail and allow customers to pay 30 cents on a stamp for all participating companies who include envelopes with billing statements.

"First it was 29 cents, then 32 cents, and now 33 cents," Cabria Stuckey, freshman at SIUE, said. "It doesn't make any sense. There is too much

money right there."

Susor said the rate will be increased by 4.5 percent, making the increase affordable.

"Every now and then the post office must raise rates to cover costs they need to pay," Susor said.

The Board of Governors reviewed the rates and sent a request to the postal rate commission.

project, done by DuPont Flooring Systems, was completed on Thursday last week. The painting project by Coleman's Painting and Kessmann's Painting and Paper Hanging, are looking for a completion date by the end of this week. Ward said re-upholstering the 42 pieces of furniture will take a little longer.

"The upholstery, we hope to have out and back prior to Aug. 20," Ward said.

Funding for the renovation project came from the UC's annual budget. Ward explained that since the project is not an every year occurrence, there is a special non-recurring budget specifically for projects like this one.

"We set aside the money for doing different things," Ward said. "Each year the projects change and these were the primary projects for this summer."

This summer's renovation

projects of carpeting, painting, and re-upholstering totaled \$100,000 from the UC's non-recurring budget.

"The annual budget (non-recurring) for the total year is roughly \$250,000," Ward said. "That includes when we have to replace or repair major pieces of equipment."

This summer's renovation project will be completed in time for the 1997 fall semester.

year 2007 and only pay tax on the difference in regards to inflation."

Congress found that for families to pay off these excessive taxes, the family must liquidate all or part of their assets, causing their business to

near the threat of closure. Taxes collected in 1996 were less than one percent of total federal revenues. Tomaszewski said Congress has heard accounts of what the death tax is doing to Illinois' farm families.

"A Christian County family's story has been used on the House floor to emphasize the effects of the tax," Tomaszewski said.

Following the death of the father in that Christian County family, the mother and sons

were left to manage the farm while also dealing with the required estate taxes. Tomaszewski said Shimkus and his constituents are hoping the budget proposals will go through as planned.

"I am unaware that

Congressman Shimkus has received any comments from his constituents wanting to keep the death tax," Tomaszewski said. "If the bill is passed we expect it to go in effect immediately with a back date of March."

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## Author and columnist Viets makes it big with a lot of wit and a knack for 'Monogamy'

**E**laine Viets, the former South St. Louis columnist for the *Post-Dispatch*, has just published her latest off-the-wall book of humor entitled, "How to Commit Monogamy." In fact, the book is so new that most area bookstores have yet to receive a shipment to sell. The *Alestle* received an audio copy from Wildstone Media in St. Louis.

The book is a light-hearted spoof on the mysteries of staying married, in her case for 25 years to the same man. Viets says that people who have been married as long as she has go to the doctor when they get that hot, fluttery feeling.

"I don't know how this happened to me," said Viets. "Our marriage started with a promising scandal. Don was 31 and my college English professor. I was 10 years younger. This was not what the university meant by student affairs."

Viets continues throughout the book to offer her own unique perspective on

monogamy, from the views of the Catholic church to Phyllis Schlafly, of the ultra-conservative Eagle Forum, who "works to keep women at home."

"Some people are embarrassed by their discovery that they find monogamy exciting and satisfying," Viets said. "No matter how scandalous your past, most people believe monogamy is as much fun as two matched socks. Nobody sees sex with a married man as fun when he is your married man."

Viets and her husband, Don, now live in Washington, D.C. where she writes three columns a week for United Features Syndicate in New York and is published in newspapers around the country, including the *Post-Dispatch* in St. Louis. In a telephone conversation, Viets and I discussed her career as a journalist and author.

She began by writing features for the *Post-Dispatch* and gradually turned them into more personal observations of life in South St. Louis until she began her own column in 1979. In these columns, Viets tries to write about subjects that will interest her audience in a humorous way.

"Inappropriate material would be those things that are just not funny," Viets said. "Like abortion, it's just too volatile a subject. Sometimes readers become very angry over something in the column and they will call me to vent their rage. I try to listen to them until their rage is spent and not take it personally."

When I asked her about the appropriateness of Corey Stulce's recent column on masturbation, she said she felt it was suitable for a campus publication since the subject would directly impact most of the population.

Having always been a fan of murder mysteries, Viets has signed a contract with Dell Books for a three-volume series. The first, due out in October, is called "Backstab" and is about a female detective named Francesca Vierling. She will be returning to St. Louis to research

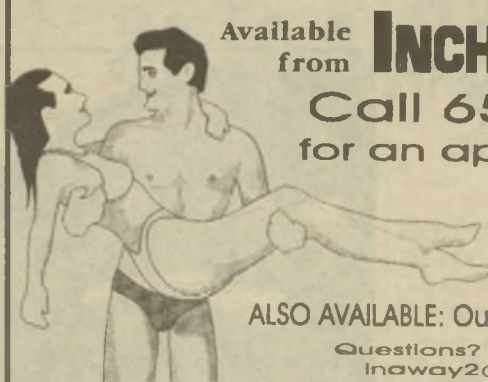

The down fall is the Cardinals only have two all-stars.

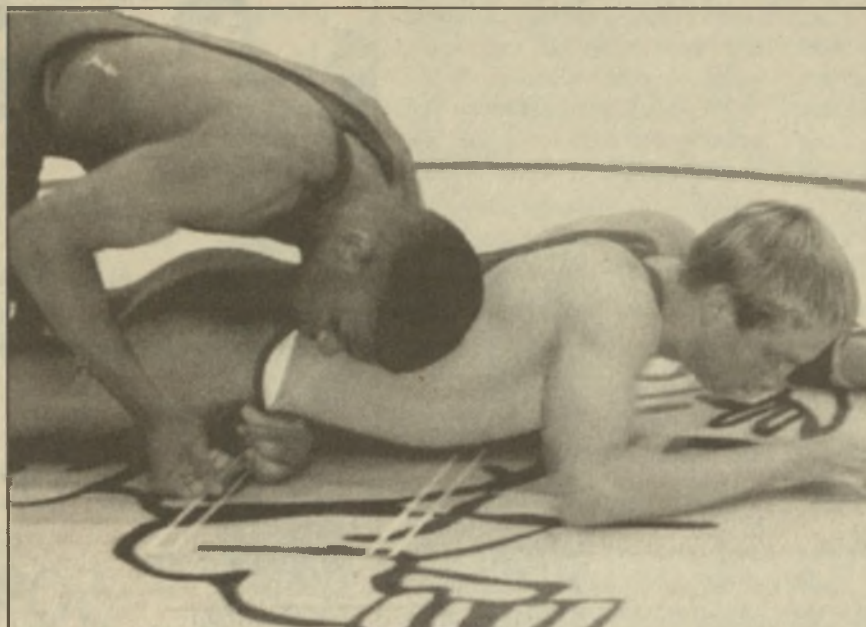
Going into the season the Cardinals looked like they were one of the teams to beat and they lived up to that end of the bargain.

There are two reasons why SIUE would want to host the U.S. Youth Soccer Region II Olympic Development Program from July 8 to 18.

The schedule is broken into two sessions. The first, which started yesterday, will schedule the '81 and '83 age teams.

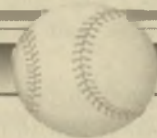
Then the second session will have the other three age groups scheduled.

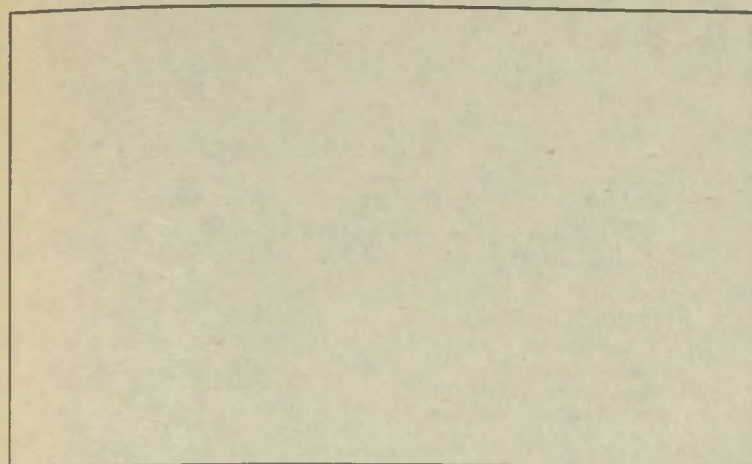

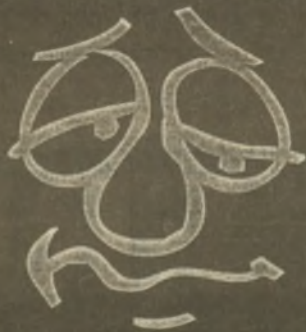

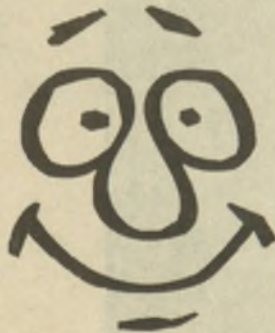
