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

SUBJECT: United Way and Combined Health Appeal Campaigns

For several years the members of the University community have participated in the annual United Way campaign which provides money and services to numerous agencies within the region served by the University. This year state agencies will also be participating in the Combined Health Appeal of Illinois campaign. The Combined Health Appeal organization was formed in order to benefit a number of worthy agencies which are not normally included in the United Way drive. A United Way and Combined Health Appeal campaign will be conducted from November 2-13. Contributions may be directed to any of the six United Way agencies in this area, as well as to the Combined Health Appeal agencies. Material will be distributed to each employee by solicitors in the various units.

The University's contribution to the United Way has increased steadily, to last year's record high of nearly \$31,000. This success is due, in large part, to the increased number of employees who have elected to use the payroll deduction plan.
