It is a pleasure to announce the appointment of Benjamin F. Quillian, Jr. to the office of Vice President for Administration effective July 1, 1988. The appointment is subject to ratification by the Chancellor and formal action by the Board of Trustees. Dr. Quillian will succeed Earl Beard who has served as Vice President for Administration since January, 1986.

Currently, Dr. Quillian is Assistant Vice President for Administration, a position that he has held since March, 1987. Earlier, for a period of five years, he served first as Assistant Director and then as Associate Director of University Personnel Services. From 1978 to 1982 he was Director of Affirmative Action. His association with SIUE began in 1972 when he was appointed to the faculty of the Delinquency Study and Youth Development Center.

In 1983-84, Dr. Quillian was selected by the American Council on Education as a fellow in Academic Administration at Washington University. He attended the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University in 1981. He has held several teaching and administrative appointments in other institutions within the Metro-East region.

Dr. Quillian received his baccalaureate degree at Harris Teachers College in St. Louis and his master's degree in Educational Administration at SIUE. His doctoral degree in Social Relations in Education was completed at Washington University.

I look forward to working with Dr. Quillian in pursuit of the mission of the University.
