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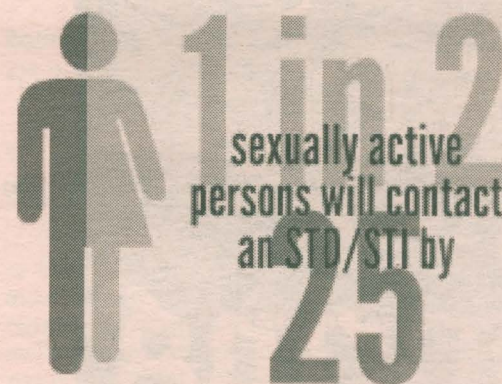


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Post-cuddle oopsies: What you need to know if cuddling goes too far

NOT-SO-FUN FACTS: STDS AND STIS

Infection	Symptoms	Health Services test cost
Syphilis	Stage 1: Painless sores that may last 3-6 weeks; often unnoticed Stage 2: Rashes, fever, sore throat, hair loss, headaches, weight loss, fatigue, muscle pain Stage 3: Can appear 10-20 years after infection; causes damage to internal organs	\$8
Gonorrhea	Usually none; burning sensation, discharge, swelling, redness and/or pain may occur in penis, vagina, anus, mouth or throat.	\$17

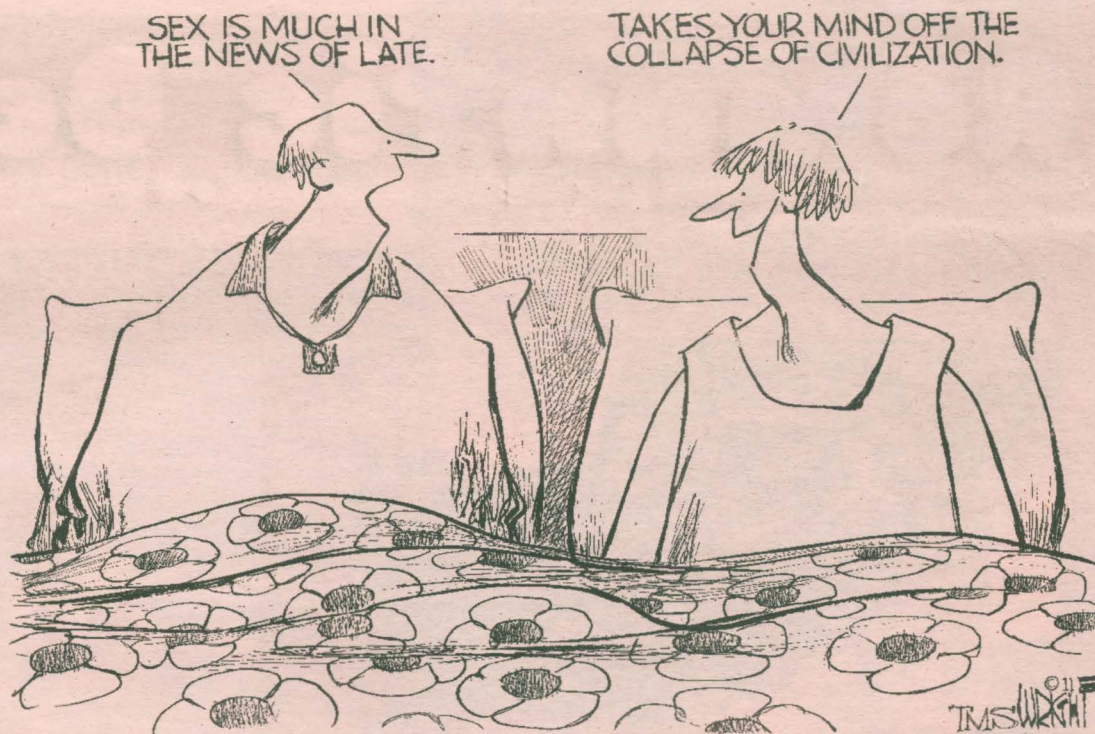

Cuddling and skin-to-skin contact release oxytocin, a happiness and bonding chemical. The same chemical is released during orgasm and labor causing people to feel closer together. Freshman biology major Shakhara Harris, of South Holland, does not reject the idea of staying home for a romantic evening.

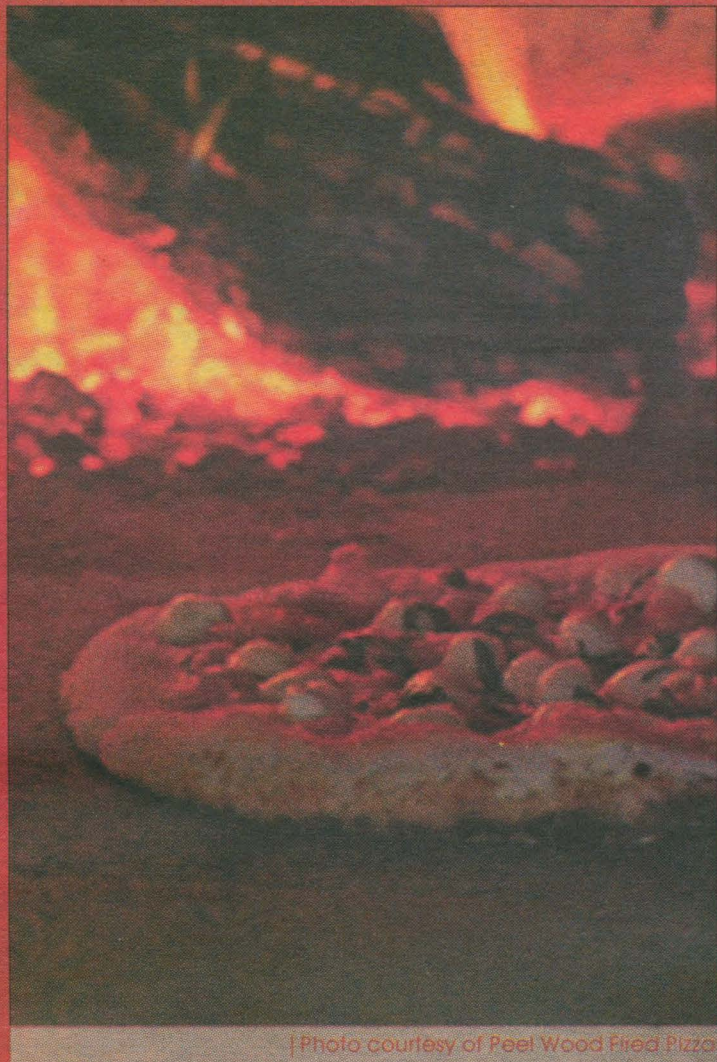
"I think it would be cute if the guy cooks the dinner," Harris said. "Not anything big but better than going to the movies or something."

Steinberg's will be open from 10 a.m. until 9 p.m.

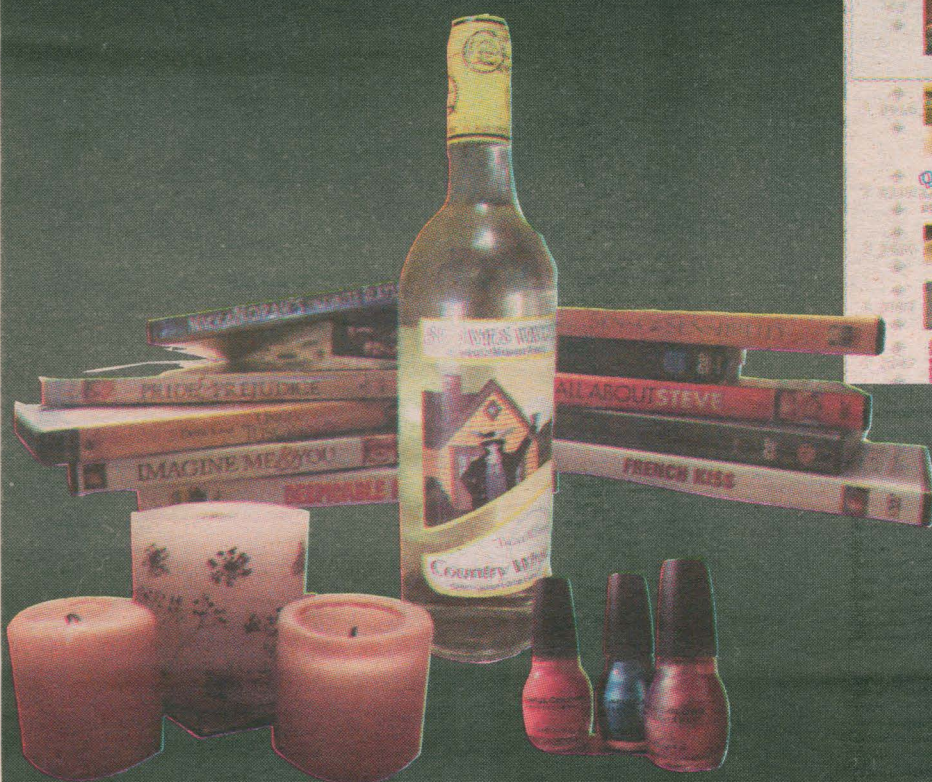

Valentine's Day recipe: Red velvet cookies

Ingredients

- 1 box red velvet cake mix
- 2 eggs
- 1 stick (or ½ cup) butter or margarine
- 1 small tub whipped frosting
- 1 package lemon pudding mix
- 1 package raspberry Jell-O mix

Cookies

Preheat oven to 350 F. In a medium-size mixing bowl, stir cake mix, eggs and butter until well blended. Roll or dollop tablespoon-size portions of batter onto cookie sheet coated with non-stick spray or parchment paper. Bake for 15 minutes. Yields approximately 30 cookies. For smaller cookies, use a teaspoon and bake for 10 minutes.

Frosting

Scoop whipped frosting into small mixing bowl. Stir in pudding mix until blended.

Decoration

Spread icing onto cookies, then sprinkle Jell-O mix on top, as you would use sugar crystals or sprinkles. Let frosting set.
